Make reservations early as once the reserved rooms are gone FWS can not guarantee the \$99 price at the Marriott.





COPYING WITH COPYING

Do you copy?

I know the answer already, and it is “yes”, because we all copy at some level, and I think we need to be clear on the what, how and why of copying.

There are no laws restricting what you paint as long as you’re not copying someone else’s painting. In this case, the law says that when a person paints a painting it is copyrighted. To show this you can put a “©” and your name on your work, but the copyright is yours regardless, from the time you finish the work until you relinquish rights to it. You don’t have to register it. You don’t have to provide proof, or a statement of copyright, and if anyone else copies it without your consent they can be sued for damages for copyright infringement.

But there are times when copying, if not purely legal, is allowed. If you are a student and want to copy for educational reasons, it’s usually okay. If you copy and sell the work you are breaking the law. Thus when you see students in museums painstakingly reproducing paintings of the masters, old and new, they should be aware that if the paintings are really old, they probably are in the public domain and you don’t need to worry about copyrights. You’ll see students doing the same from books or other sources, but you must be careful about published sources. Selling or representing these copies as your original work OR as the work of the original artist is illegal. This is the deal in a nutshell, but be assured you can read volumes on copyright law and trials if you want examples.

But copying has many other aspects. For instance, if you want to know a specific

technique used in someone’s painting, it is perfectly legal to copy that technique and introduce it into your own work. It’s legal to copy the conceptual design of another artist as long as you aren’t reproducing the copied work. In other words, don’t claim it’s yours if it looks like the original painting. It is illegal to copy photos, symbols or logos that are copyright or registered, such as photos from newspapers or magazines or TV scenes (I don’t know how Campbell Soups dealt with Andy Warhol, but that’s another story). Personal photos or those by others (used with their permission) are a legal source for painters. It’s wise to have a written approval by the owners.

Doing paintings as “homage” allows you to work in the manner of the artist to whom you’re paying respect (homage), and it’s always good to add “In Homage” to the title so everyone knows you’re not breaking the law.

Among the things we can glean from copying the masters’ (or non-masters’) work as described above include inspiration, technique, conceptual design, a way to test oneself, and to satisfy curiosity about how someone else painted.

Without understanding how others have painted we waste a lot of time and effort by not incorporating or adopting their approaches and practices. What they do is important to us because learning from it means we don’t have to reinvent painting. That’s why, when I was a student at U of F, I was assigned paintings to be copied from a book by Ted Kautzky, then the most famous of all American watercolor painters. I don’t think anyone cared about legality, because none of us came anywhere close to the originals, and, for that matter, never have.

So, when and if you copy, ask yourself these questions:

- What do I want to extract from this exercise?
- Can I really do a good job of copying?
- Am I just curious? Testing myself? Looking for other ways to express myself?
- Can I define what I like about the piece I’m copying and focus on that alone?
- Am I trying to paint a painting exactly like the one I’m copying?
- How will this exercise make me a better artist?

When you know the answers, please act in accordance with the law, good judgement, and a hunger for knowledge.

Copy selectively- and stay out of trouble!

Meanwhile;

Keep your brush wet!
